### IMPORTANT! ATTENTION VOTERS! NEW IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING IS AN OPTION - STARTS SAT. OCT 26 THRU SUN. NOV 3

As a result of legislation enacted into law, the State of New Jersey will be offering in-person early voting on a machine during a nine day period. In addition to providing early voting, registered voters will continue to have the option of voting by mail or in-person at their polling place on Election Day. There will be 8 early voting sites throughout Morris County. New electronic poll books will be used to sign-in voters. Poll workers will be available to assist all voters in using these new devices. The early voting locations are listed below. Hours for early voting are Monday-Saturday, 10am to 6pm and Sunday 10am to 6pm. It doesn't matter where you live in Morris County - registered voters can go to any of the 8 sites and conveniently cast your ballot on a voting machine.

PUBLIC QUESTION TO BE VOTED UPON  
Question No. 1  
"Shall the Borough of Rockaway be authorized to amend the Length of Service Awards Program ("LOSAP") of annual contributions of deferred income account for its volunteer firefighter and rescue squad members who meet Borough-adopted eligibility criteria to increase the maximum annual LOSAP contribution for firefighters to two thousand twenty-three dollars (\$2,023.00), along with automatic annual Consumer Price Index ("CPI") adjustments thereafter?"  
Interpretive Statement  
"The Borough of Rockaway LOSAP currently offers a maximum contribution of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) per firefighter who meets eligibility criteria adopted by the Borough, and the Borough LOSAP does not currently provide for annual CPI adjustments. This proposed increase would take effect for 2024, and the Borough estimates that the annual cost of the program would be seventy thousand eight hundred five dollars (\$70,805.00)."

### EARLY VOTING & ELECTION DAY

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING

- Please read through the instructions completely. After receiving the ballot card given to you by the poll worker insert it into the card slot on the right of the device with the cut corner of the card facing the upper right.
- Touch candidate names to make your selections. Your selection will turn Green. To change your selection, touch the Green Box again and it will de-select that candidate. You may make a new selection.
- To write-in a candidate, select the Write-In box, in the last column, across from the office you wish to write-in. A keyboard will appear. Type in the first and last name of the person of your choice. Touch "Accept". Your write-in choice will appear on the ballot.
- When you have completed voting and verified your selections, touch the Green "Print and Review" button on the right side of the screen. A confirmation message will first be displayed to "Return to Voting" or "Print".
  - To make any changes before printing the voter paper audit trail, touch "Return to Ballot".
- To proceed with printing the voter paper Ballot, touch "Print". This will print the candidates you have selected on the Ballot card and display it in the printer window for your review.
- Review ballot card to ensure it represents your selections accurately. Then touch the "Cast Your Ballot" button, then confirm by selecting "Cast" if what is displayed on the Ballot card accurately reflects your choices.
- If changes need to be made after printing the Ballot card, touch the "Quit" button to cancel the voting session. A poll worker will be signaled to assist you. You must return your spoiled Ballot card folded to the poll worker in order to receive a new Ballot activation card to start the voting process over.
