As a result of legislation enacted into law, the State of New Jersey will be offering in-person early voting on a machine during a five day period. In addition to providing early voting, registered voters will continue to have the option of voting by mail or in-person at their polling place on Election Day. There will be 8 early voting sites throughout Morris County. New electronic poll books will be used to sign-in voters. Poll workers will be available to assist all voters in using these new devices. The early voting locations are listed below. Hours for early voting are Wednesday-Saturday, 10am to 6pm and Sunday 10am to 6pm. It doesn't matter where you live in Morris County - registered voters can go to any of the 8 sites and conveniently cast your ballot on a voting machine.

EARLY VOTING & ELECTION DAY

- #### INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING
- Please read through the instructions completely. After receiving the ballot card given to you by the poll worker insert it into the card slot on the right of the device with the cut corner of the card facing the upper right.
 - Touch candidate names to make your selections. Your selection will turn Green. To change your selection, touch the Green Box again and it will de-select that candidate. You may make a new selection.
 - To write-in a candidate, select the Write-in box in the last column, across from the office you wish to write-in. A keyboard will appear. Type in the first and last name of the person of your choice. Touch "Accept". Your write-in choice will appear on the ballot.
 - When you have completed voting and verified your selections, touch the Green "Print and Review" button on the right side of the screen. A confirmation message will first be displayed to "Return to Voting" or "Print".
 - To make any changes before printing the voter paper audit trail, touch "Return to Ballot".
 - To proceed with printing the voter paper Ballot, touch "Print". This will print the candidates you have selected on the Ballot card and display it in the printer window for your review.
 - Review ballot card to ensure it represents your selections accurately. Then touch the "Cast Your Ballot" button, then confirm by selecting "Cast" if what is displayed on the Ballot card accurately reflects your choices.
 - If changes need to be made after printing the Ballot card, touch the "Quit" button to cancel the voting session. A poll worker will be signaled to assist you. You must return your spoiled Ballot card folded to the poll worker in order to receive a new Ballot activation card to start the voting process over.

This is a PRIMARY ELECTION. Therefore you are confined legally to a choice of candidates for nomination within your own Political Party. The machine is so adjusted as to comply with the law, and will not permit you to vote in the Primary of more than ONE Political Party.
