### **EARLY VOTING & ELECTION DAY**

#### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING**

- 1. Please read through the instructions completely. After receiving the ballot card given to you by the poll worker insert it into the card slot on the right of the device with the cut
- corner of the card facing the upper right.

  2. Touch candidate names to make your selections. Your selection will turn **Green**. To
- Touch candidate names to make your selections. Your selection will turn Green. To
  change your selection, touch the Green Box again and it will de-select that candidate. You
  may make a new selection.
   To write-in a candidate, select the Write-In box, in the last column, across from the office
  you wish to write-in. A keyboard will appear. Type in the first and last name of the
  person of your choice. Touch "Accept". Your write-in choice will appear on the ballot.
   When you have completed voting and verified your selections, touch the Green "Print
  and Review" button on the right side of the screen. A confirmation message will first be
  disclaved for "Return to Vointie" or "Print."
- displayed to "Return to Voting" or "Print".

  To make any changes before printing the voter paper audit trail, touch "Return to Ballot".

  To proceed with printing the voter paper Ballot, touch "Print". This will print the candidates you have selected on the Ballot card and display it in the printer

  touch the "Cast Your Ballot" button, then confirm by selecting "Cast" if what
  is displayed on the Ballot card accurately reflects your choices.
   If changes need to be made after printing the Ballot card, touch the "Quit" button
  to cancel the voting session. A poll worker will be signaled to assist you. You must
  return your spoiled Ballot card folded to the poll worker in order to receive a new
  Ballot activation card to start the voting process over.

This is a PRIMARY ELECTION.

Therefore you are confined legally to a choice of candidates for nomination within your own Political Party. The machine is so adjusted as to comply with the law, and will not permit you to vote in the Primary of more than ONE Political Party.
