<p style="text-align: center; color: red;">STATE QUESTION NO. 1</p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO PERMIT CASINO GAMBLING IN TWO COUNTIES OTHER THAN ATLANTIC COUNTY</p> <p><small>Do you approve amending the Constitution to permit casino gambling in two additional counties in this State? At present, casino gambling is allowed only in Atlantic City in Atlantic County.</small></p> <p><small>Only one casino in each of the two counties would be permitted. Each casino is to be located in a town that is at least 72 miles from Atlantic City. The amendment would allow certain persons to apply first for a casino license.</small></p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p><small>At present, casino gambling is allowed only in Atlantic City in Atlantic County. This amendment would allow the Legislature to pass laws to permit casino gambling to take place in two other counties in this State.</small></p> <p><small>Only one casino in each of the two counties would be permitted. Each casino is to be located in a town that is at least 72 miles from Atlantic City. The amendment would allow certain persons to apply first for a casino license.</small></p> <p><small>The laws passed by the Legislature would provide for the location and type of casinos and the licensing and taxing of the operation and equipment.</small></p> <p><small>The amendment provides that the State's share of revenue from the operation of the two casinos and of the casinos in Atlantic City would be used for programs and property tax relief for senior citizens and disabled residents. It would also be used for the recovery, stabilization, or improvement of Atlantic City and other purposes as provided by law. Lesser portions would be used to aid the thoroughbred and standardbred horsemen in this State and each town and county in which a casino is located.</small></p> <p style="text-align: center;">YES <input type="checkbox"/> NO <input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p style="text-align: center; color: red;">STATE QUESTION NO. 2</p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO DEDICATE ADDITIONAL REVENUES TO STATE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM</p> <p><small>Do you approve amending the Constitution to dedicate all revenue from the State motor fuels tax and petroleum products gross receipts tax to the Transportation Trust Fund?</small></p> <p><small>This amendment would provide that an additional three cents of the current motor fuels tax on diesel fuel, which is not dedicated for transportation purposes, be dedicated to the Transportation Trust Fund. In doing so, the entire State tax on diesel fuel would be used for transportation purposes. The entire State tax on gasoline is currently dedicated to the Transportation Trust Fund and used for transportation purposes.</small></p> <p><small>The amendment would also provide that all of the revenue from the current State tax on petroleum products gross receipts be dedicated to the Transportation Trust Fund. In doing so, the entire State tax on petroleum products gross receipts would be used for transportation purposes.</small></p> <p><small>This amendment does not change the current tax on motor fuels or petroleum products gross receipts.</small></p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p><small>This amendment would dedicate all of the revenue from the State tax on motor fuels to the Transportation Trust Fund. The current dedication is 10.5 cents per gallon on gasoline and diesel fuel. The amendment would include an additional three cents of the tax on diesel fuel that is not currently dedicated. The total revenue from the tax on motor fuels this fiscal year is estimated to be \$541 million.</small></p> <p><small>The amendment also dedicates all of the revenue from the tax on gross receipts of the sale of petroleum products to the Transportation Trust Fund. The current minimum dedication is \$200 million per year. This fiscal year, the revenue from the tax on gross receipts of the sale of petroleum products is estimated to be \$215 million.</small></p> <p><small>The amendment does not change the current tax on motor fuels or petroleum products gross receipts. The dedication to the Transportation Trust Fund ensures that the revenue is only used for transportation purposes.</small></p> <p style="text-align: center;">YES <input type="checkbox"/> NO <input type="checkbox"/></p>	<p style="text-align: center; color: red;">LOCAL QUESTION NO. 1</p> <p><small>Shall the Borough of Lincoln Park adopt an ordinance to amend its "Open Space Recreation and Conservation Trust Fund" (the "Fund") (which is funded through the collection of local property taxes in an amount not to exceed \$.02 per one hundred dollars of assessed value) to provide that the Fund "shall be used for the purposes of acquisition of lands for recreation and conservation within the Borough of Lincoln Park and/or for the purpose of development and maintenance of lands acquired for recreation and conservation purposes."</small></p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p><small>Currently, the annual tax levy of up to \$0.02 per \$100.00 of assessed value of real property is specifically allocated/divided as follows; up to \$0.01 per \$100.00 of assessed value of real property may be used for the acquisition of lands for recreation and conservation purposes and, up to \$0.01 per \$100.00 of assessed value of real property may be used for the development and maintenance of lands acquired for recreation and conservation purposes. A "yes" vote would amend the specific allocation/division for which the total annual tax levy of up to \$0.02 per \$100.00 of assessed value of real property may be used to allow for the acquisition of lands for recreation and conservation purposes and/or for the purpose of development and maintenance of lands acquired for recreation and conservation purposes, providing the Borough with flexibility in the use of the funds. Examples of how the funds may be used include, but are not limited to, field, turf and playground installation and maintenance, landscaping, lighting, fencing, equipment, safety measures, and acquisition of property.</small></p> <p style="text-align: center;">YES <input type="checkbox"/> NO <input type="checkbox"/></p>

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING

- 1 Press the button to the right of the candidate of your choice; a green "X" will appear next to your selection.
- 2 To change a selection, press the button again. The green "X" will disappear and you may make a new selection.
- 3 If you wish to cast a WRITE-IN vote (you may not write-in any name that is printed on the ballot for the same office), go to the WRITE-IN column and press the button next to WRITE-IN across from the office you wish to write-in. A blinking green "X" will appear. Using the alphabetical keyboard below, enter the name of the person of your choice, one letter at a time. To make a space between first and middle name or initial and last name use the arrow pointing to the right on the keyboard. To make a correction, use the arrow pointing to the left. The name you ENTER will appear in the display to the left of the keyboard. When you have entered the whole name, proof it, then press the enter button on the keyboard. Your choice is recorded and removed from the display. Do not press the cast vote button until all other choices are complete. (Each write-in is a separate entry.)
- WARNING!** An improperly cast write-in vote will be void. Be sure that your write-in vote is cast in the WRITE-IN column on the same line as the office for which you are casting the write-in vote.
- 4 To vote on the PUBLIC QUESTIONS press the button to the right of the word "YES" or "NO"; a green "X" will appear next to your selection.
- 5 After ALL selections have been made, press the RED CAST VOTE BUTTON located in the lower right corner. This electronically records all of your votes.
- 6 Part the curtains and exit the voting booth.
