## **MORRIS COUNTY CLERK ANN F. GROSSI, ESQ.** **ADDRESSES ELECTION RESULTS**

Morris County Clerk Ann F. Grossi, Esq., would like to reassure all voters, regardless of party affiliation, that the 2020 General Election will be conducted in full compliance with all applicable statutes and laws.

“My staff and I are working diligently to ensure that full compliance is being adhered to all aspects of Governor Murphy’s Executive Order #177 and subsequent directives from his office on how the state will conduct a predominantly vote-by-mail election this November. This includes fulfilling my duties as Secretary to the Board of Canvassers, which makes up the Board of Elections.”

Her statement was issued in response to concerns expressed by voters about whether the election results would be properly certified after ballots are counted in this unique election cycle. New Jersey has never had held a predominantly vote-by-mail general election.

The County Board of Canvassers is comprised of four Commissioners, two Republicans and two Democrats, who certify the election totals and delivers them to Clerk Grossi for her signature.

“As the Secretary to the Board of Canvassers, I have faithfully signed off on those election results for the past seven years and I am committed to doing so in the 2020 General Election.” Clerk Grossi states, “As a Constitutional Officer and as an Officer of the Court, I take an Oath to adhere to the rule of law, I am bound by that Oath, and I will ensure that Oath is upheld.”
